# You Are My Disciples

**Welcome!!** This booklet is meant to be completed with your mentor in correlation with confirmation at Bethel Lutheran. By now, you are probably looking forward to spending your second year together growing in faith. Now that you are in 8th grade, there are a few more modules for you to work through. Thanks for your willingness to learn together. This booklet is designed to facilitate conversation and help you both learn about aspects of your faith life. Here's what is expected of you:

### **Expectations of Mentors**

\*Attend future mentor meeting at the church.

### Wednesday, March 8th at 7:30 pm - Funeral Mentor Event

- \*Meet with student at least five times during their 8<sup>th</sup> grade year to complete the four modules and one mentor event on March 8<sup>th</sup>.
- \*Be the adult in the relationship if you have not heard from the student check in with him or her.
- \*Attend worship together.
- \*Realize that the student has picked you as an important, trusted and admired Christian adult. Please, take that seriously. If you can, attend their extra-curricular events at school, write them a letter or postcard to encourage them (8<sup>th</sup> grade is not an easy time), take them out for ice cream, <u>pray for them</u>, etc.

### **Expectations of students**

\*Meet with your mentor at least five times during your 8<sup>th</sup> grade year to complete the four modules plus one mentor event. Mentor event is scheduled for:

### Wednesday, March 8th at 7:30 pm

- \*Call to set up the five times to meet.
- \*Realize that your mentor may be unsure how to be comfortable with a junior high youth. Greet them when you see them, smile and wave. Keep your mentor in your prayers.
- \*Return your completed mentor booklets to the pastors by April 15th, 2017.

There are four "modules"—conversation guides and short projects, to complete in 8<sup>th</sup> grade. They are listed below with a short description or tips for completion of each step. There could be some prep involved with each, so read this overview first before you dive in.

### Modules - 8th Grade Year

- 1) Worship
  - Attend three worship services together
  - O Discuss the variety of worship services at Bethel. The "Gathering" is generally when the welcome to worship; this could involve prayers, a confession and hymn singing. The "word" section of the service begins usually when someone reads from the Bible. This is the learning section. The "Meal" we celebrate is communion, the sacrament which binds us together. This could be prayers, reciting a creed, passing the peace, etc. Even if there is not communion, are there other elements after you learn something before the "sending"?
  - o Study the sanctuary of the church and learn about its symbols.
  - o Discuss the seasons of the church year.
  - o Spend time sharing about your worship and church-going life together.

### 2) Daily Living

- o Talk about prayer and devotion practices.
- o Discuss the way your church ministers to its members.
- o Attend a regular meeting of the Planning Council together.

### 3) God, Jesus, Holy Spirit—The Trinity

- o Questions will walk you through questions about Jesus and why we follow him.
- o Discuss your questions about the Holy Spirit.

### 4) Death & Dying: Funeral Mentor Event

- Attend the mentor event together at Vertin Munson. We will meet at church first, then proceed to the funeral home together.
- Debrief and follow the questions in this book to talk about your experiences of death and dying.
