Board Spotlight



The Board of Lay Ministry consists of five members. Current members are Cyndy Kolle, Jim Cornelius, Sonja Christensen, Aaron Riebe and Larissa Gilbertson. The primary responsibilities of this board are membership and worship. We deal closely with the pastor and office staff. Areas include, but are not limited to the following: plan and publicize regular and special services for the year. Christmas and Easter are the busiest times for Bethel. Decorating the church for Christmas is a 3 day event at Bethel. It takes a village to do all the decorating. Arrange for volunteers and animals for the Live Nativity which is held on the same Sunday afternoon as the Children's Christmas program. Set annual communion schedule. We have a volunteer who arranges the schedule of volunteers for the actual communion prep and clean-up. Arrange for care and use of the altar, altar ware, hangings, vestments, furnishings, etc. Again, we have a volunteer who is responsible for the scheduling of the altar paraments change. Overall responsibility for the music in all worship services. This includes scheduling special music during the summer months; and cantors to help the pastor during Sunday morning services. Provide instructions for ushers. Maintain and supervise adequate nursery and personnel. Work with the soundboard volunteers.

BeFrienders provide pastoral care for people in all kinds of difficult and transitional situations. They are trained volunteers who extend the care of a faith community. 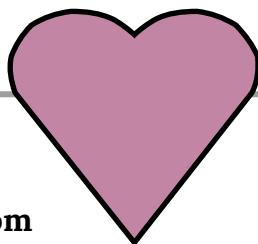

Operation Christmas Blessing by Julie Carlson

The **Board of Outreach** would like to thank everyone who helped make this program a success, it was a direct result of our generous and loving congregation. We decided to bring back a previous program of purchasing Christmas gifts for area children. This program was self-referral, if a family in our community felt they needed help buying their child(ren) Christmas gifts, they had the opportunity to sign up. We did it this way, because we don't always know who is struggling and really wanted to create minimum barriers. Once families were identified, we had over 100 children ready to be shopped for on November 20th. By the following Wednesday, every child had been signed up for and the congregation continued to call and donate. The response was amazing, and in the end 109 children were shopped for and 34 families had a little brighter Christmas. Despite it being the beginning of a blizzard, December 13th was a fun and special day. Families were invited to stop by the church to pick up gifts. We had volunteers available to help wrap, Christmas music playing, warm drinks, and Christmas goodies to eat. Hearing the chatter between the parents stopping in and members of our congregation was truly special. Families were invited back to Wednesday school and/or to worship with us, connections were made, and barriers lowered. The simplicity of having a positive experience within our church cannot be understated. In addition to the generous gifts our congregation purchased, families also received a gift card to either Econo or Walmart and a Christmas ornament. With the extra monetary donations, we were also able to donate \$100 to Breckenridge Elementary to purchase gifts for a family and \$150 to Wahpeton High School's Sources of Strength group. This organization has been putting together "Blessing Baskets" gifted to those students needing a boost this holiday season and throughout the school year. At one point throughout the night a young mom arrived then left right away, after some brief confusion she was back with her boyfriend because she was so excited to show him the gifts. The look on her face was simply Joy, and maybe some relief. The best words to leave you with are those of the families, below are some of the thank you notes Bethel received:

*Thank you from the bottom of my heart. You have made our Christmas that much more special, and I cannot thank you enough.

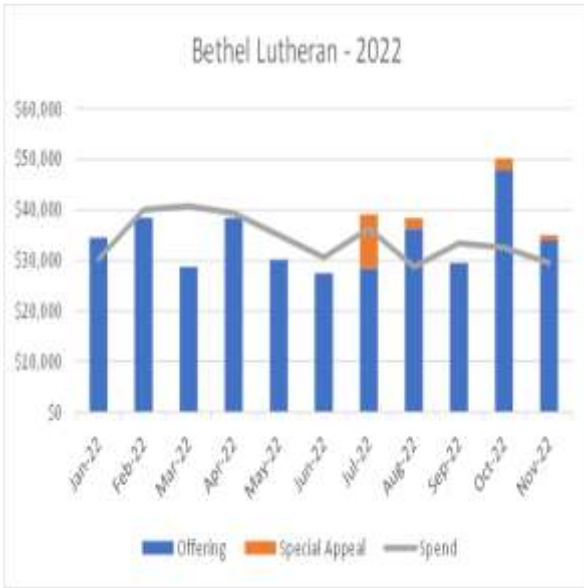

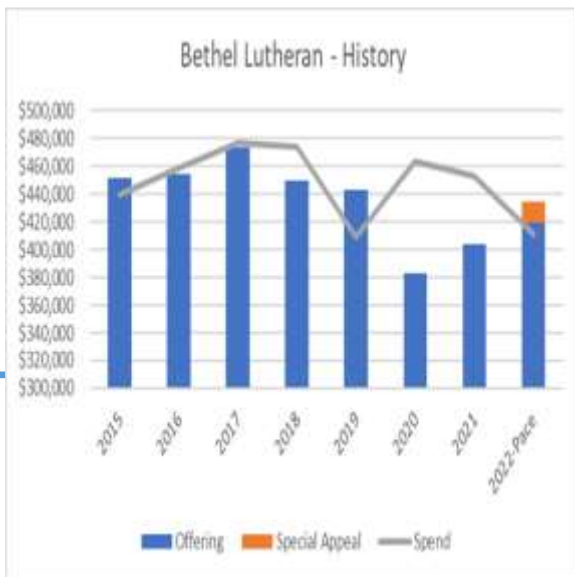
