- New format one worship service at 10:00, Annual meeting right after, potluck following. The new format allowed time for discussion.
- The operating fund of the congregation rebounded from a balance of \$-53,260.00 on 12/23/2022 to a balance of \$622.00. Exciting!
- Transition feedback from the congregation is helping gain insight for the Ministry Site Profile as we seek to fill our present Pastor vacancy. Nominations for the Call Committee are due by February 14 and their work will begin in late March.
- 4. Entering a Capital Campaign passed unanimously to reduce present mortgage debt of \$878,683.50. A thoughtful discussion about continuing to seek the goal of a \$100,000 for the outreach fund and using the Capital Campaign to reach that goal. Passed 42-36. Before the Capital Campaign begins (in the spring), logistics of how pledges and monies received will be properly designated and put into the correct funds will be fully explained.
- 5. Elections held . Staffing positions to be filled secretary and custodian
- Balanced budget passed. Solo pastor into the future.

THE POWER OF VISION - Leads to Purpose & Mission: JESUS SHOWED US!

This year, for our mid-week Lenten services, we will, each week, use parts of the Holden Evening Prayer for worship, and deal with a message from Pastor Tom. The short scripture texts will come from Jesus' vision of God's challenging plan for our good and a thoughtful video vignette about the power of vision to influence individuals, organizations and nations.

It was the Old Testament prophet Jeremiah who wrote down the words, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."(Jeremiah 29:11). Then Jesus would say, "I have come that you might have life and have it abundantly" (John 10:10) "and eternally" (John 14:1-5). He came on a rescue mission to save us and call us to reach out to a hurting world. There is a lot of depth to all these statements. God certainly has a plan for us personally and for His people, the Church.

Over the years, studying Jesus' teachings and his life and other biblical writers and scholars from different fields of study, each in their own way has convinced me that it is essential that we think about, intentionally pray about, dream about, and ultimately envision our own futures. Especially in the really tough times. In fact, I believe that having a hopeful, faith-filled, positive vision of the future is perhaps the most forceful motivator for change that you and I possess. If we decide to, those statements of belief can make our own organizations, our own families, our own lives richer and more fulfilling. This is the uplifting theme we are going to briefly highlight in each of the Wednesday mid-week Lenten services. To summarize Jesus' guidance: "A great commitment to the Great Commandment and the Great Commission will grow a great church." Sincerely, in Christ - Pastor Tom
