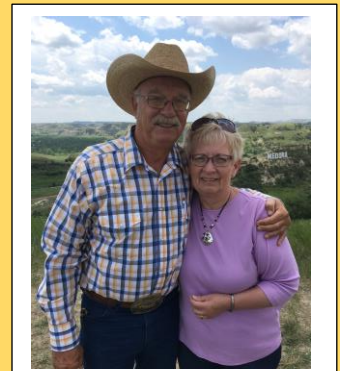

Message from Interim Pastor Tom...

“Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son...” John 14:12-13

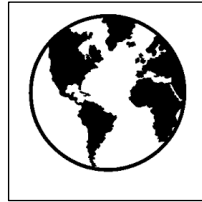

During the month of **July, the Noisy Offering** will be going to Richland-Wilkin Backpack Program. According to a study by Feeding America, there are 16,360 kids in ND who are food insecure. The same study found that 320 of these kids are in Richland County. This means 1 in 10 children in the county are food insecure. In order to provide meals to kids who may not have access to them, the Richland Wilkin Food Pantry started the Backpack Program. Since its inception 9 years ago, the program has provided many kid friendly, shelf stable meals for kids to take home so they can eat over the weekend.
