Pastor Tom's Message—"Two Inches of Faith" (Read Luke 2:22-40)

It's a new year and we are filled with hope—for ourselves and for those we love.

As Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the temple for consecration a short time after his birth, we are reminded that they had no idea what lay ahead of them. You would think, when you read the Christmas story that Mary and Joseph could look forward to a charmed life. After all, their son was the Messiah. Their life should be easy. Their child was in God's care. Little did they know what lay ahead.

Indeed, none of us knows what the future holds for ourselves or for those we love.

As we enter a New Year, know, just as Mary and Joseph knew, that both we and those we love are in God's hands. That doesn't mean life will always be a smooth road for us. Everyone encounters bumps along the way. We get discouraged, sometimes even bitter, but we don't give up, for we trust that an Unseen Hand is leading us.

It's like a church I visited, St. David's Episcopal Church in San Diego, California. From the parking lot, a long, winding path leads to the sanctuary, landscaped with trees and plants indigenous to the Holy Land. Walking through the olive trees and fragrant flowers, the first thing that a visitor sees is a solid, even cracked, unfinished concrete portico extending from the worship space. The stark broken-ness of the entry is startling. Even more shocking is the support, or lack thereof; it appears to be held up by two massive concrete pillars, but when one looks closely, the pillars stop two inches below the overhang. It appears that there is nothing supporting the massive, cracked concrete structure.

I asked the guide, "Is it structurally sound?"

The answer is "yes." It was constructed in full compliance with the state's building codes. But the architects intentionally designed the real support to be invisible. According to the brochure, "The entry to that sanctuary represents all people as we come to Christ broken and unfinished. And although we have many visible and tangible supports on our Christian path, such as scripture, worship, the sacraments, and our faith community, that last 'two inches' of our Christian journey is built on faith. Faith in things that we cannot see."

Mary and Joseph trusted in that which they did not see. They were like most families. They struggled with their finances. They tried their best to raise their son, but there is much evidence that they did not quite understand him. They lived by that—that invisible "two inches" that we all embrace. They made it. So can we.

We enter into this New Year filled with hope—which is different from blind optimism. God's unseen presence is with us. We pray for ourselves and others for guidance and a godly perspective. We also engage each day and we engage those we love and those around us. Let us move out into 2024 with conviction and boldness—undergirded by our faith and trust in god's love for us as seen in Jesus Christ.

Adult Sunday Morning Discussion Group






