Leader: Our Lord Jesus knelt to wash the feet of His disciples. Let us come before God to confess our need for Cleansing and forgiveness.

(Silence for reflection and self-examination)

Stripping of the Altar

After the stripping of the altar – which is symbolic of Jesus' humiliation at the soldiers hands – and the reading of Psalm 88, no further words are said. There is no benediction; no postlude; the church is left in semi-darkness and we leave the church in silence. Continuity with the service of Good Friday is extended as it is all one extended service from Maundy Thursday through Easter morning.
