Affirmation of Baptism

Confirmation marks the completion of the congregation's program of confirmation ministry, a period of instruction in the Christian faith as confessed in the teachings of the Lutheran Church. Those who have completed this program were made members of the church in Baptism. Confirmation includes a public confession of the faith into which the candidates were baptized, thus underscoring God's Action in their Baptism.

Pastor: I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Confirmands: I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? Confirmands: **I renounce them.**

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? Confirmands: **I renounce them.**

Do you believe in God the Father? (confirmands read bold type)

Confirmands: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic church,
the communion of saints,

the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen

Pastor: You have made public profession of your faith.

Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Confirmands: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

Pastor: People of God, do you promise to support and pray for one another in your life in Chirt?

Congregation: We, do and we ask God to help and guide us.

Students, parents, God parents, and mentors will come to the alter when they are called. Confirmation students will kneel at the altar. Hands will be placed on the confirmands shoulders as they are prayed over.

Let us rejoice with these sisters and brothers in Christ.

We rejoice with you in the life of baptism. Together we will give thanks, praise to God, and proclaim the good news to al the world.
