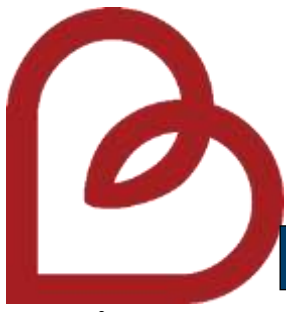

Note from Pastor Rich

Music. I love it. I can't write it, nor can I sing well publicly. Still, I love how tune & tone combine with words to create amazing, wonderful moments. What's playing in your "mind's ear now?"

Thank you! To all who can create, play, sing, & bring to life, God moments through music.

A few years ago, I picked up the book Then Sings My Soul, by Robert Morgan. Simply put, Morgan writes short histories of how great Christian music, in its early stages in the West, came to be. After reading one story, I thank God for two people:

Firstly, I thank God for Anna B. Warner. Anna, along with her sister, Susan, became prolific writers in the mid-1800's to support their family. They wrote over 100 publications. One of their more successful projects was the book Say and Seal. From this story came words written by Anna & spoken by a character living in a most difficult time. The words are known by billions: "Jesus loves me this I know, for the Bible tells me so..." Thank you Anna, for using your God-given gift of writing powerful stories to build-up people's faith in God.

Secondly, I thank God for William B. Bradbury, a hymn writer from New England & a contemporary of the Warner sisters. When William read the story & words noted above written by Anna, he composed music to accompany them. This newly composed song soon became the most well-known & beloved children's songs in western Christendom. Thank you, William, for using your God-given gift of placing the right notes in the right places at the right times for the tune, "Jesus Loves Me." The notes he composed & arranged have become part of my "audible muscle memory of faith", just as muscle memory kicks in when I ride a bike each spring.

What we do as Christians matters. Perhaps we don't compose music. Perhaps we don't write stories & poems that impact billions of people. Still, it matters what we do for the sake of the world. The impact God makes through us may not become apparent for generations. We don't have to have "Jesus" be the every-5th-word we speak. Still, as we incarnate Jesus' teachings, as we make them part of our actions & our words—so many people can be blessed, can come to know God's love for them, or can be re-introduced to the God who so loves the world.

Thank God for Anna & William. They used their God-given abilities to help others know Jesus.

Friends in Christ, we can follow their lead. Sing in church! The program year is up & running soon. Let's discover, for this season, what each of us can do to impact God's world for good.

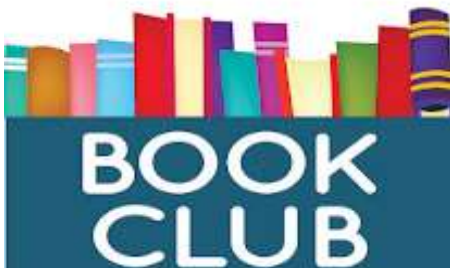

We meet the first Tuesday of every month at 7:00 pm at Bethel Lutheran. We read a wide variety of books chosen by members. Please come and join us!

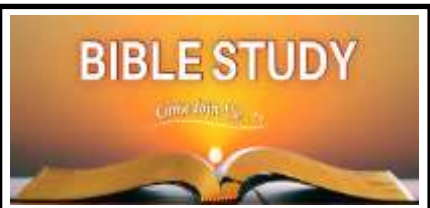

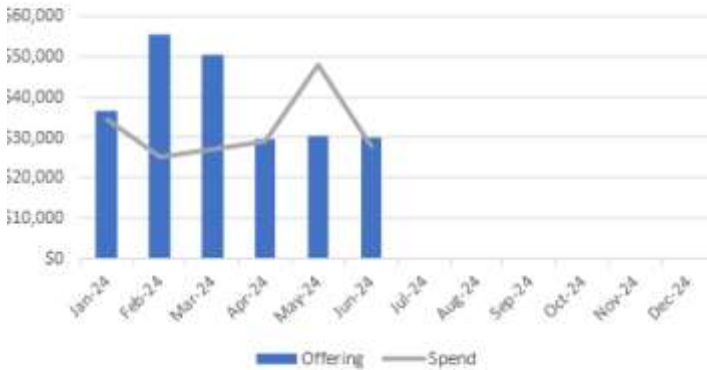

Roof Repair/Replacement Fund Update:

This fund was started in 2023 to assure money would be set aside to replace or repair our flat roof. We have had some leaks repaired & know that in the upcoming years we will have to replace. A flat roof in our area comes with its own problems. **As of August 11th, 2024 we have \$10,285.56 in this fund.** Thank you to all who have contributed to this fund! New Ministries—Bethel has teamed up with St. Catherine's for **two** new ministries.

Flowers for the residents! The first ministry involves our Altar flowers. Each week we take the Altar flowers to a resident of St. Catherine's. The flowers brighten their room for a week. Many are overjoyed to see the flowers & the staff say it brightens their moods. This ministry brings as much joy to the person delivering the flowers as to the resident. You can be involved too! You can sign up for Altar flowers or just donate to this ministry. Altar flowers cost \$30 & can be ordered in memory or honor of someone or thing. (Ex: birthdays, anniversaries, life events) Simply write Altar flowers in the memo on your check or envelope with the date you would like them on the Altar or go to our website (www.bethelwahpeton.com) & click on the Altar Flowers tile on the Give page.

The second ministry allows us to visit with residents @ St. Catherine's. The ***Friends of St. Catherine's*** meet each Wednesday @ 1:00pm to visit with a group of residents. We gather in a space where we can all be included in the conversation. We talk & share stories with the residents for one hour & sometimes go outside for a walk or just to enjoy the sunshine. The residents look forward to us coming each week & it brightens our week as well. If you would like to join us, come to door 3 @ St. Catherine's on Wednesdays @ 1:00pm. We meet there & then pick up the residents as we go to our meeting room.

GriefShare Support Group

Each person's grief is unique. So too, is each person's grief recovery. There are enough commonalities in bereavement to be able to share practical tips & coping strategies to help you manage your grief. A GriefShare support group is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. Through this 13-week group, you'll discover what to expect in the days ahead & what's "normal" in grief. Since there is no neat, orderly stages of grief, you'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief, in all its unpredictability & gain solid support each step of the way. Join us starting on Monday, September 23rd @ 10am for this 13-week support group. We will watch a video & have discussion on what you learned & how it applies to your situation. Hearing what others are going through will reassure you that your grief is normal. That's why you should share your experiences too. Your words can comfort others. The class cost is \$10 to cover the cost of your workbook. If finances are a problem, please let us know & we can help you out. Helping Hands Ministry @ Bethel
